ABI Rehabilitation provides long-term residential rehabilitation options in Auckland and Wellington.

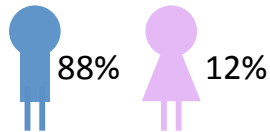


The residential service operates across several houses in our suburban neighbourhood. Altogether, we have space for 33 clients. We operate at full capacity and currently have a waiting list.

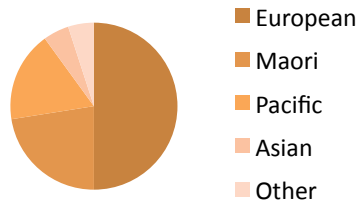
In 2014, we served a total of 41 clients. During the year, we welcomed 9 new clients and said goodbye to 10 old friends.

ABI Rehabilitation serves clients who have significant disability and support needs. Our specialised team of nursing, therapy, and carer staff have expertise for client groups with high medical needs, disorders of consciousness, and neuro-behavioural issues. Our aim is to provide the best quality, client-centred community care in a home-like environment. Staff focus on clients' quality of life and ensure that good health and function is maintained to allow full participation.

Genders:

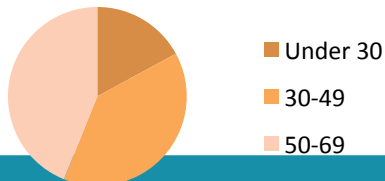


Ethnicities:

Average = 45.7 years



100% of our clients have had a brain injury or stroke.

On average, our clients have lived with us for 7 years (range = 0-18 years).

In 2014, 20 clients completed the QOLIBRI, which is a quality of life questionnaire specifically for people who have had a brain injury. On average, clients rated their quality of life as 60.7 on a scale of 0-100, where 0= worst possible quality of life and 100= best possible quality of life.

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
