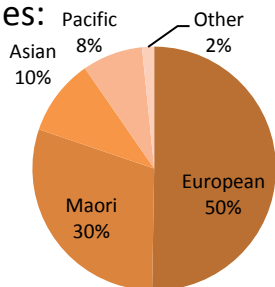

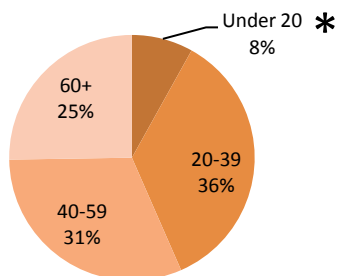

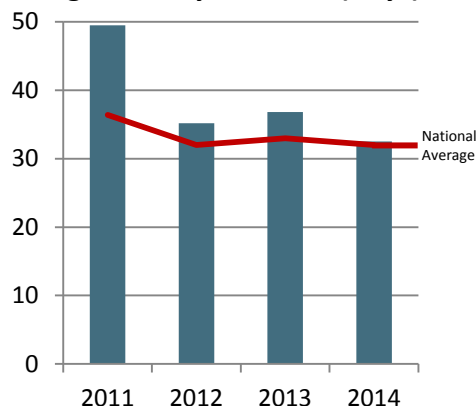

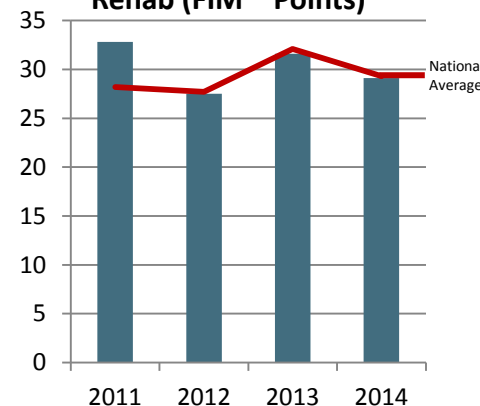

Length of Stay in Rehab (Days)



On average across 2014, clients stayed in rehab for 32 days. This is shorter than in previous years, and is the same as the national average.

Functional Improvement During Rehab (FIM™ Points)



The FIM assessment is done at the beginning and end of rehab. Higher scores mean that the client is able to do more things for themselves.

Percent of clients who went home after inpatient rehab:

93%

This is better than the national average of **84%**.

* Outcomes for Adolescents

Although ABI Rehabilitation’s inpatient rehabilitation is primarily a programme for adults, we served ten 16- and 17-year-olds with TBIs in 2014. The teens stayed at the rehab centre for a shorter time (on average, 4 days fewer) and had similar outcomes to other clients: nine went home, and one transferred to another rehab centre.
