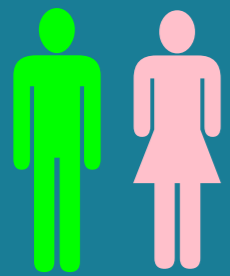

TBIs were most often related to **motor vehicle incidents, falls and assaults**

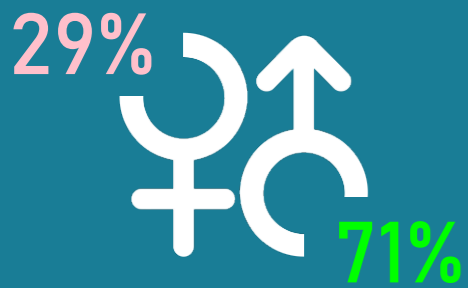
WHAT WERE THE OUTCOMES?

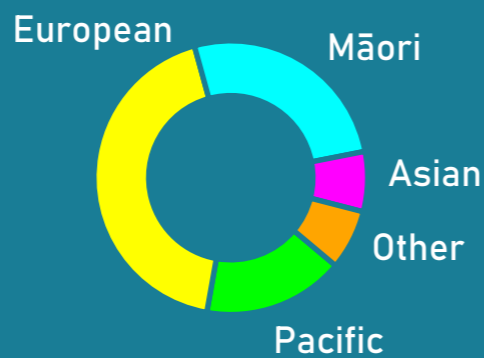
GENDER



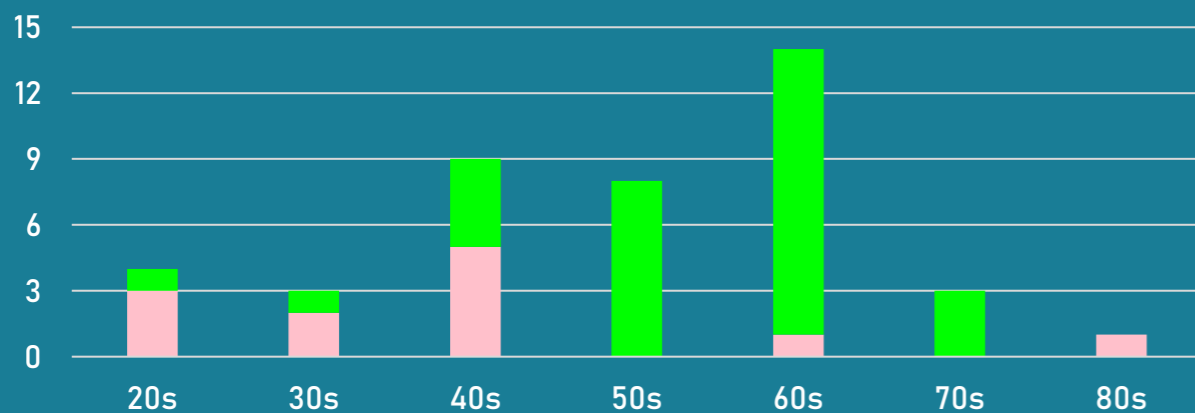
AGE



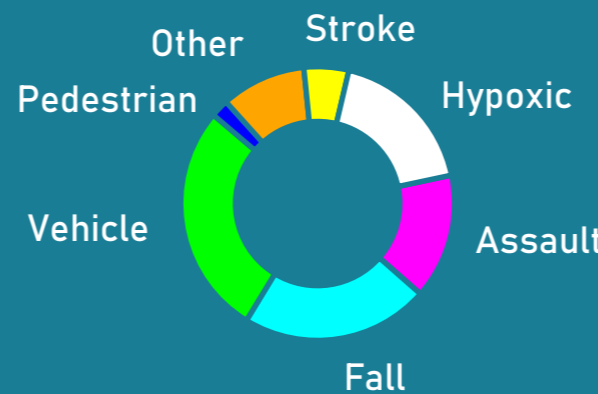
ETHNICITY

62% of clients have a traumatic brain injury



38% clients had a non-traumatic brain injury (stroke, lack of oxygen, or other neurological conditions)

Residential Rehabilitation Service provides ongoing slower paced specialised neuro-rehabilitation services for adult clients following severe brain injury. This service is for clients with high medical needs, and/or high physical/cognitive impairments that currently prevent that person from returning home.

Goals of the service are:

- Whenever possible to help a client return to their home/community
- Maximise and/or maintain functional independence
- Encourage socialisation, community integration and engagement in leisure activities that enhance quality of life.

All neuro-rehabilitation programmes are individualised, goal driven, developed in collaboration with the client and their whānau, and reviewed regularly.
